Youth living in Scarborough Center between ages 13-21 are invited to prepare a proposal on how to make Scarborough a better place for Youth. The competition is open to all youths living in Ward 21. An individual can submit an application on their own or as a representative of a youth group. All proposals should be submitted by email to keisha.francis@toronto.ca. The submission deadline is March 2nd, 2020. Proposals will be reviewed by a panel of judges and the top three projects will be selected. The selected applicants will be given an opportunity to present their proposal at the Scarborough Centre Youth Forum on Saturday March 21, 2020 hosted by Deputy Mayor Michael Thompson.

When will the contest be open?

Entries will be accepted from February 3, 2020- March 2, 2020 at 11:59:59 p.m.

How do I participate?

Submit a proposal on how to make Scarborough a better place for Youth.

You can choose from the three categories below:

1. Visual – design a poster, infographic, photo collage or any visual art
2. Written – submit a short article, proposal, poem or essay of no more than 400 words
3. Video/Audio – create a video or audio piece no longer than five minutes

Entries must be submitted to Councillor Thompson's office by email to keisha.francis@toronto.ca.

What do I need to know before I submit my contest entry?

All entrants must have a signed consent and release form (available in [PDF](#) and [HTML](#)) for submission and agree that their project could be used in the public domain.

Can my contest entry be disqualified?

An entry will be disqualified if:

- It is late, illegible or inaudible, incomplete, forged or reproduced;
- Any third-party trademarks, brands and/or logos are used or displayed in any part of the submission, obviously or subliminally;
- It negatively depicts another person, country, race, religion, age, gender, sexual orientation or disability; or
- It contains content deemed offensive or inappropriate including but not limited to nudity, vulgarity or violence.

How will you select the entries to be showcased?

Entries will be selected on the basis of creativity, innovative thinking and overall community impact.

My entry has been selected! What next?

Selected individuals will be invited to join Deputy Mayor Michael Thompson at the Scarborough Centre Youth Forum on Saturday March 21st from 10am-3pm where they will be given the opportunity to present their proposal. An award will be presented to the top three finalists at the event.

If for any reason a selected participant cannot be reached through the contact information provided, or does not respond within seven days of being contacted, their entry will not be accepted and another participant will be selected.
